# Tangled Feet are a theatre ensemble whose members are about to turn 40. They met 20 years ago and have been creating theatre together for half their lives.

To mark the moment, Tangled Feet have created a unique intergenerational company of 10, 20, 40 and 80 year-olds to wrestle some of life's big questions:

#### How does our perspective change as we age? How do we cope when we don't know what's coming next? Are we always going to feel like we are making it up as we go along?

Premiering at the Albany in Deptford as part of the *Age Against The Machine Festival of Creative Aging, Half Life* attempts to bring together people from across the generational divides in a playful, anarchic celebration of growing up and growing old.

Tangled Feet are a collaborative ensemble who met in the year 2000 and over the past two decades have honed a making process of creating theatre from physical improvisation and play. An artist-led company, the people who founded the ensemble at university still form the core team, responsible for producing, directing, finances, stage managing, van-loading, a number of extensive participation programmes, and writing countless funding applications. Having made nearly 30 shows together, Tangled Feet have devised, sung, played musical instruments, dangled from scaffolding at great heights, danced and thrown a lot of shapes, touring the UK and internationally, for half of their lives to date. They have also seen each other through births, marriages, deaths and divorce - all the big stuff. But are they the same people who met 20 years ago?

Made over a period of a year, *Half Life* has involved an extended invitation to people of all ages and from all walks of life, throwing open the doors to a rehearsal space of crash mats, climbing frames, hula hoops and huge quantities of tea and biscuits in an attempt to join the dots between our 10, 20, 40 and 80-year old selves.

*Half Life* has been co-commissioned by the Albany, Deptford, ARC, Stockton and Gulbenkian Canterbury.

**Co-Artistic Director Kat Joyce said** "An ensemble approach to theatre is something that goes in and out of fashion, but as it becomes harder and harder to see what the future holds, a commitment to continue making work together becomes ever more important. 'Half Life' is a celebration of the values of ensemble theatre making - long-term collaboration, compromise, mutual support and collective discovery."

**Nathan Curry said:** "In our intergenerational ensemble we've found brilliance in all forms - wisdom, playfulness, perspective and the challenge to go on new creative journeys together. We can all learn something from people half our age - and twice our age - and at a time where we feel increasingly disconnected, it's life-enhancing to try to close the gaps which have opened up between people of different generations."
